DELIVERY DATE:

All artwork is to be delivered to the assigned venue on Tuesday morning, April 30, 2024 between 11 am and 1 pm. Late entries will not be accepted.

ELIGIBILITY:

The fabulous fakes exhibition is open to all 2024 members of the Art League of Henderson County. New members are welcome. Membership application and dues must be paid in advance or accompany the entry. Only one entry per person will be accepted (artwork must be viewable by patrons of all ages).

SPECIFICATIONS:

Each entry must be an adapted rendering of an old master, master, or prominently recognized artist. The fake needs to include a visual twist or change that makes the painting or 3-D piece uniquely yours.

Maximum size for 2D work is 34" x 40", outside edge to edge, including frame.

Minimum size must be 11"x14" edge to edge, including frame. Work under glazing and over a half sheet in size (15"x22"), except for pastel, must be glazed with acrylic sheet, not glass. ALHC will not be responsible for glass breakage.

All media for "fake" renderings that can be hung on display, displayed on a 12"x12" or sit on the floor will be accepted. 3D work must be of a size that will sit on a 12" square riser or on the floor. ALHC is not responsible for any damage to artwork.

All paintings must be framed or on a gallery wrap of at least a 1.25" thickness. Work must be properly wired for hanging (NO SAWTOOTH HANGERS). Paintings with defective frames or dirty glass will be rejected.

The artist's name, address, telephone number, medium, title and price must be attached securely to the reverse side of each work.

ENTRY PROCESS:

DEADLINE FOR APPLICATIONS IS APRIL 3/19?, 2024. All applications must be submitted electronically. Exhibiting artists will submit a completed application form for each entry through the ALHC website < -- [CLICK HERE TO REGISTER](#) -- >. The online submission form also contains an electronically signed waiver of liability at the bottom. No paper applications will be accepted. Artwork will be accepted on a first come basis until available space is filled.

Be prepared to upload an image of the masterwork you are basing your Fabulous Fake on (not your finished artwork). You will need to upload a masterwork digital image at the time you register. A clear, reproducible image of the original Master work is needed for display next to each entry. The image should be a high-resolution jpeg, and represent the image only, showing frame, mat, or other background distraction. You must name your image file as follows:

VENUES:

ArtMoB, Flat Rock Gallery, ArtPlace and others. The Fabulous Fakes Committee will determine which work goes in each gallery. Entrants may not indicate a preference for one location over another.

SALES:

All work must be for sale and there is a commission of 30% on any piece sold. Sales will be handled by each gallery. All work must hang through the duration of the show (unless an out-of-town purchaser). Any works not sold will be moved and rehung at ArtPlace from other galleries on Monday, May 13?, 2024.

The Art League of Henderson County announces a call for submissions for the La Vie en Rose' Fine Art Exhibit and Gala. This year, the Marked Tree Vineyard is partnering with The Art League of Henderson County to bring you the fourth annual Wine and Art Gala. The event takes place over a period of four days in June. Also collaborating are the Arts Council of Henderson County and the Hendersonville Symphony. The Fine Art Exhibit will be installed in a grand tent on the beautiful grounds of the vineyard. An exclusive ticketed preview "Gala" will take place on Thursday, June 6th, from 6 to 9 pm. The Gala event includes a special performance by the popular Jason DeCristofaro and his jazz ensemble. Attendees will enjoy a sampling of Marked Tree's charcuterie and a complimentary glass of their award-winning wine. Following the Gala event on Thursday evening, the exhibit will be open to attendees through the balance of the weekend. Weekend events include the wildly popular Atelier fashion show by several local boutique clothiers on Friday evening, music and Saturday art events, a Latin dance party under a second large tent provided by the Arts Council of Henderson County. Sunday's line-up includes several concerts, concluding with a sunset symphony performance by the Hendersonville Symphony on Sunday.

The Venue: The Fine Art Exhibit venue will be an artfully decorated and draped tent with a wine bar and music performance area. In addition to the jazz performance at the ticketed Gala, a chamber music concert is planned for Saturday afternoon in the Art League tent. All attendees to every ticketed event and visitors to the winery will enter through the art exhibit on a red carpeted walkway which runs through the art exhibit.

Juror: Chicago based Beth Swanson is a curator, artist, and creative director. The founder of Chicago's Rostrum 312, Swanson is passionate about supporting fellow artists by creating opportunities to show and sell work. Rostrum 312 provides a platform for artists to exhibit and sell their work through pop up art galleries, mural collaborations, and installations throughout Chicago. Prior to launching Rostrum 312 Swanson held the position of Creative Director at Studio Ruckus an organization that provides small businesses, nonprofits and charities with advertising campaigns and graphic design services understanding that good causes deserve good. Her experience in creating visual experiences in non-traditional venues is a perfect match for our goal to create a unique experience for the LaVie en Rose' Art Gala. Swanson has a BS in Art and BA in Studio Art.

Marketing Plans: Extensive marketing is planned both in print and digital/social media for the event. Each collaborating organization will distribute marketing to their membership/wine club members/patrons and to their marketing email databases. On-site live social media will extend marketing throughout the event. Participating artists will be provided graphics and copy for their personal marketing efforts.

Before you apply: You will be required to provide artwork Title, Size, Price, and uploads of images of your work. Payment is required at time of registration and can be paid by

credit card. You will also need to upload an Artist Statement no longer than 200 words which describes you, the artist, and your artistic process, so please have that ready.

Entry Deadline: May 15, 2024

Exhibition Requirements:

Artists aged 18 and over with residences in the regional area of North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and Tennessee are invited to apply.

Each artist may submit up to three pieces of art. The entry fee for up to three pieces of artwork is \$40.00 and is non-refundable. Your entry fee does not guarantee acceptance into the exhibition.

Artwork must be family-friendly and appropriate for the public. Artwork that does not meet this standard will be rejected.

All artwork must be the sole work and exclusive property of the submitting artist. Your submission must be originally conceived: your own reference, your own drawing, your own concept and must have been self-created. Paintings created in an instructional setting, including but not limited to workshops and art classes, are not eligible.

Maximum size 2-D, including frame: 60" x 60". 3-D work must hang, be free-standing or fit on a riser surface. Weight limit is 50 lbs.

Unframed 2-D pieces should be appropriately presented as gallery wrapped and no staples should be visible.

Artwork **MUST** arrive dry, wired, and ready to hang. No clip frames or sawtooth hangers will be accepted.

All artwork must be available for purchase and priced appropriately. Prices must remain as submitted. ALHC retains a 30% commission for all sales.

Art must remain in the exhibition for the duration of the show, even if sold unless special arrangements are made for out-of-area purchasers.

The artist retains copyright to his/her image(s). However, by submitting to this show, artists agree to ALHC's use of the images for publicity for event promotions and archival purposes.

Artist agrees to abide by all rules in the prospectus. Submissions of entries and entry fee, which is non-refundable, constitute agreement with all conditions set forth in this prospectus.

IN ADDITION TO THESE REQUIREMENTS, IT IS IMPORTANT TO FOLLOW THE PROCEDURES BELOW VERY CAREFULLY, ESPECIALLY WHERE THEY RELATE TO NAMING YOUR IMAGES FOR THIS EXHIBITION, AND DIRECTIONS FOR DROP OFF.

- Artists do not need to be present throughout the event, but are encouraged to do so. Artists are not included in the giveaways that are part of the ticket price. Exhibiting artists' guests will need to purchase a ticket.

Application Procedures and Details

Jurying will be digital. Submission for this exhibition is handled in one of two ways. All applications and artwork image uploads must go through the Art League Registration system. Artists who encounter technical difficulties can request help from the Art League staff. Questions related to the exhibit can be sent to the Exhibition Director at gallery@artleaguehvl.org.

It is very important that artists upload only one jpeg image for each piece of art being submitted. Thus, if the artist submits one piece, they will submit only one photo, or two photos for two pieces of art, etc. Please check that the artwork is properly oriented in the photo and that the frame or other peripheral objects are not included in the image. Attention should also be given to the keystone effect and glare, which are common issues in photographing artwork. The exhibition juror will select the participating pieces from these digital photographs; the prize winners will be selected by the judge viewing the original art at the exhibit once the exhibit is installed. Artwork images cannot exceed 5MB.

Digital artwork image files must be titled as follows: (Artist's) LAST NAME-FIRST NAME-TITLE – for example Jones-Adam-Water Lilies. Any images uploaded with incorrect titles will not be eligible for jurying. Do not upload images with the numeric numbering system of your camera or cell phone. In the questions section of the application form you will enter the title of the artwork and not the digital image label information.

Accepted work, when delivered, must include the following information on the back of the artwork: artist name, title of the piece, category, price, email address, phone number. ALHC will use this information to correctly identify your piece.

Not All entries will be chosen to display in this exhibit. No refunds will be given if your work is not selected. We reserve the right to refuse any work that does not comply with all specifications or differs greatly from submitted digital images. Your electronically submitted entry form signifies your agreement with the terms and conditions stated herein, including to use accepted entries for advertising purposes.

We are very limited on space, so any art not picked up by the deadline will remain the property of ALHC unless other arrangements have been agreed upon in advance.

As life isn't all springtime, so to those that hold special memories, their voices still echo in your ears, they will remain as one of us. Cecil Frances Alexander, a poet and hymn writer in 1800s, she is best known for this simple poem – 'All things bright and beautiful, All creatures great and small, All things wise and wonderful, The Lord God made them all.' "All Creatures Great and Small" (named from the second line of the poem) is based on James Herriot's tales of a late-1930s Yorkshire veterinarian. About the Class: Relationships are one of the most rewarding — as well as the most frustrating aspects of our lives. Whether in intimate or work settings, the quality of our relationships has an enormous impact on the quality of how we live, our self-esteem, and our careers. Yet, we often find the behavior of others baffling — even if we have known them intimately for many years. Often, the things we do not understand in others are the greatest sources of problems and conflicts in our relationships. Clearly, the better we know ourselves and the people in our lives, the more harmonious and satisfying our relationships will be. This is a workshop for Couples. Couples will work together to connect through Somatic Art. We will access areas where the individual may be blocked from their artistic expression and how the couple may find a deeper connection through artistic communication. Using tools from EMDR/Bilateral Stimulation, Enneagram Typing/Character types, and IBSR Somatic mapping each participant will create a deeper connection with themselves and others.

We will remove unhealthy stress and open up the artist's palette to physical expressions of color, mental descriptors, and balancing of the art/science part of our brain, or organized side while opening it up to the fully self-expressed side. We will remove barriers to creativity and discover what artwork best suits you.

We will help participants recognize personal strengths as well as to uncover the blind spots that they bring to their relationships. If you want to improve your relationship with a spouse, child, friend, business associate, or family member, this Workshop will be invaluable.

What skills, experience or pre-requisites are required for this class?

Pre-req's teacher will send some materials via email for participants to fill out at least 24 hours before class. Participants will bring, tissue, a journal, favorite pens, pencils, and markers.

Now retired from the Mental health profession as a licensed clinician, she has found a way to disrupt behavioral health and the art world by bringing what was once used only in a clinical setting to treat unhealthy stress to the mainstream. Judi occasionally teaches, coaches, and supervises clinicians and non-mental health professionals in unhealthy stress that leads to trauma. Couples using Somatic Art are her specialty. She also teaches real estate agents how to apply stress-reducing tools to the art of communication between buyers and sellers of property. In addition, she is a top Real Estate Agent in WNC and owns her own Real Estate Firm, Grateful Mindset Properties, where she serves WNC & beyond with a

grateful mindset and volunteers for many nonprofits in the area as a charity liaison and more. In addition, she has a weekly radio show combining, art, science, and a tad of real estate.
